### Kuna and Lipa, Banknotes and Coins of the Republic of Croatia

The kuna, the monetary unit of the Republic of Croatia, was introduced on 30 May 1994, when it replaced the temporary currency the Croatian dinar.

As the change of a national monetary unit is a landmark social and economic event, and often has a political dimension, the introduction of the kuna also held a special importance for the then young independent state of Croatia.

Money is considered a very significant characteristic of sovereignty, a mirror of the country of issue. Money is also a mark of the identity, history and culture of a people. The symbolic role of money is one of its key features and its name adds to this role.

Since their arrival in their present homeland, the Croats have used various forms of money. Only a few of the names for money employed by the common people are known today.

The Croatian dinar was introduced in late 1991, the year that Croatia gained independence. It replaced the Yugoslav dinar, a currency used in the territory of today's Croatia, which was then a republic in the former federal state.

The Croatian dinar was introduced as a temporary monetary unit to enable monetary independence amid the adverse economic circumstances and war-inflicted destruction of the times, coupled with high inflation.

In the process of deciding on the name and appearance of a permanent Croatian currency, the Commission for Drafting a Proposal for a Monetary System Concept and the Manufacturing of the Republic of Croatia Banknotes announced in late August 1991 that the Croatian dinar would at a convenient moment be replaced by the permanent Croatian currency – the Croatian kruna, divided into one hundred banica.

The choice of the names the Croatian kruna and banica caused public debate, with arguments for or against.

Taking into consideration these arguments, the Commission proposed a new solution: that the names the Croatian kruna and banica be replaced by the kuna and the lipa. The Croatian Parliament accepted the proposal, and in August 1993 the provisions on naming the monetary unit of the Republic of Croatia the kuna and its hundredth part the lipa were incorporated into the Act on the Croatian National Bank.

The name of the monetary unit the kuna comes from the Croatian word for marten, an animal living in the Croatian woods, whose pelts were used as a means of trade, that is, functioned as money. The history of the Croatian kuna, which originated as a means of payment in kind to become a unit of account and an actual currency that in some periods featured an image of the marten, is comparable with the history of many other currencies.

A decision had to be made on an appropriate name for the hundredth part of the kuna. As the name the kuna derives from the animal world, a counterpart was sought for it in the plant world. A proposal was given for the name the lipa (linden), which is very easy to pronounce and has its origins in the traditions of Croatian folklore, literature and history.

The Stabilisation Programme, completed in early October 1993, succeeded in bringing down the inflation rate and stabilising it at a low level. On 30 May 1994, the Croatian National Bank released into circulation the kuna and lipa, which became the legal tender in Croatia.

Released into circulation were 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500 and 1000 kuna banknotes as well as 1, 2 and 5 kuna and 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50 lipa coins.

The design concept for the banknotes is by Miroslav





Šutej, Šimun Šutej and Vilko Žiljak. Each banknote has its main colour. The obverse of the banknotes features a leading figure of Croatian history and culture, while the 5 kuna banknote bears an image of two Croatian noblemen related by blood, who were treacherously executed because of their pursuit of freedom for the Croatian people. The reverse of all banknotes shows a panorama or a typical Croatian town motif.

The banknotes' appearance and features have been slightly altered over the twenty years that they have been in use: the 10 kuna banknote's main colour has been changed to grey and all banknotes have

been improved by new security features. Therefore, in addition to the issues from 1993, the improved 2001, 2004 and 2012 issues are now also in circulation.

The denomination numeral on the obverse of the 1, 2, 5, 10, 20 and 50 lipa coins is displayed against a background in the form a blooming linden branch and on 1, 2, and 5 kuna coins this background is formed as an image of a running marten. The currency name is positioned below the denomination numeral and the background.

The reverse of all kuna and lipa denominations features a motif of a plant species (on lipa coins) or an animal species (on kuna coins) living in Croatia next to the minting year.

The names of the plants and animals are in Croatian on the coins issued in odd years (since 1993) and in Latin on the coins issued in even years (since 1994).

The first commemorative 25 kuna circulation coin issue was released by the Croatian National Bank in 1997, and was followed by eleven issues released into circulation to date to mark events of special importance for the Republic of Croatia.

The design concept for kuna and lipa circulation coins is by Kuzma Kovačić and the 25 kuna design concept is the work of Damir Mataušić.

Over the past twenty years, kuna banknotes and kuna and lipa coins of the Republic of Croatia have been accepted as one of the main features of its identity and sovereignty.

Late in 1993, the Croatian National Bank invited a tender for the graphic design concept of the Croatian coinage. The new Croatian currency was to be called kuna and its hundredth part the lipa. Kuna and lipa coins were to feature flora and fauna motifs. The design of Kuzma Kovačić was chosen from among seven sculptors' entries as the best model for minting kuna and lipa coins.

The kuna, both symbolically and by name, relates to the hundreds of year old Croatian history. Marten pelts were once used as a means of payment, Croatian coins featured an image of the marten and the name of the Croatian money, kuna, comes from the Croatian word for marten. This year marks the twentieth anniversary of the nine coins of various denominations bearing motifs of typical Croatian species: a corn stalk, a vine branch, a common oak branch, a tobacco plant, an olive branch, the Velebit degenia, a nightingale, a tuna fish and a brown bear.

At a session held on 10 May 1994, chaired by Dr Pero Jurković, the Croatian National Bank Council adopted the Decision on Issuing Banknotes and Coins Representative of the Monetary Unit of the Republic of Croatia.

### 1 Banknote Sets

The Croatian National Bank has produced and released for sale collectors' sets of Croatian dinar and kuna banknotes.

The banknotes are placed in special folders consisting of covers and plastic sheet inserts with interleaving. The banknotes making up the sets have not been in circulation and are in perfect condition. All the banknotes in a set have the same serial letters and numbers.

A Croatian dinar set consists of twelve banknotes in all denominations issued from 1991 to 1994, which includes 1, 5, 10, 25, 100, 500, 1,000, 2,000, 5,000, 10,000, 50,000 and 100,000 Croatian dinars.

The kuna set consists of the nine banknote denominations issued to date, which includes 5, 10, 20, 50, 100, 200, 500 and 1,000 kuna – issue 1993 and 10 kuna – issue 1995.

A set consisting of a commemorative 10-kuna circulation banknote, issue 2004, and a commemorative 20-kuna circulation banknote, issue 2014, was released for sale to mark the 20<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the introduction of the kuna as the monetary unit of the Republic of Croatia.

The Croatian National Bank also offers for sale uncirculated Croatian dinar banknotes in the original manufacturer's packaging of 1,000 banknotes. The denominations include 1, 5, 10, 25, 100, 50,000 and 100,000 Croatian dinars. Currently available are the denominations of 1, 5 and 10 Croatian dinars.

The Croatian dinar banknote design is by Zlatko Jakuš.

The kuna banknote design is by Miroslav Šutej, Šimun Šutej and Vilko Žiljak.

### 2 Coin Sets

# 2.1 Numismatic Sets of Kuna and Lipa Circulation Coins

Every year, the Croatian National Bank issues a numismatic set of circulation coins in the denominations of 5, 2 and 1 kuna and 50, 20, 10, 5, 2 and 1 lipa. The coins in the set are identical in appearance to circulation coins in the given year.

Numismatic coin sets issued in odd years comprise coins bearing the features specified in the Decision on the Denominations and Basic Features of Kuna Banknotes and Kuna and Lipa Coins (Official Gazette 37/1994), with the minting year and the names of animals and plants inscribed in Croatian.

Numismatic coin sets issued in even years comprise coins bearing the features specified in the Decision on the Denominations and Basic Features of Kuna Banknotes and Kuna and Lipa Coins (Official Gazette 47/1995), with the minting year and the names of animals and plants inscribed in Latin.

The coins in the numismatic sets are in brilliant uncirculated condition and sealed in rectangular 166 x 111 mm hard plastic casing.

# 2.2 Set of Kuna and Lipa Circulation Coins, Issue 1993

In order to promote the Republic of Croatia and its monetary unit, the Croatian National Bank issued a set of circulation coins bearing inscriptions in four languages: Croatian, German, English and Italian. The coin set is sealed into a transparent plastic sheet, mounted in a suitable cover. Printed on the cover is an article on the Republic of Croatia and the basic features of the coins, accompanied by the photographs of cities, important monuments and natural beauties of the Republic of Croatia.

# 2.4 Numismatic Sets of Commemorative 25 Kuna Circulation Coins

In 1997, the Croatian National Bank issued and put into circulation a new coin denominated at 25 kuna. The coin, intended to be issued on special occasions, has the features of a commemorative circulation coin, with the motif on the obverse related to the occasion marked and that on the reverse identical on all issues. The term "commemorative circulation coin" implies a limited and exactly specified number of items issued.

Shaped as a regular dodecagon, the commemorative 25 kuna circulation coin is bimetallic (with the core exhibiting gold and the ring silver lustre), which is a technological innovation in coin minting.

During 1997, the Croatian National Bank released three different issues of the commemorative 25 kuna circulation coin, which were combined in a numismatic set.






Obverse and Reverse of the Vukovar 500 Kuna Gold Coin, 1997




